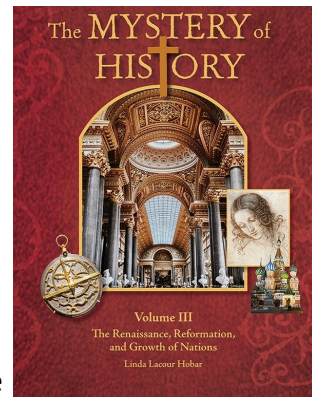
Renaissance, Reformation,

6<sup>th</sup>—8<sup>th</sup> Grade

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### Course Overview:

We will follow the Mystery of History Volume III which picks up where Volume II leaves off, beginning with the Wars of the Roses in England and chronologically continuing through the Renaissance and Reformation in Europe, dynasties in India, native Australians, the Tokugawa family in Japan, conquistadors, explorers, and more. Journeying from 1455 to 1707, your students will read stories of artists, scientists, and writers of the Renaissance integrated chronologically with significant events of the Protestant Reformation.

We will be learning history through the stories of those who lived it; stories about people are more interesting than dates and events. Weekly assignments will vary to provide opportunities for different learning styles; regular mapping exercises integrate geography. Semester projects will give students the ability to focus on a favorite topic.
