

# Apologetics & Worldview



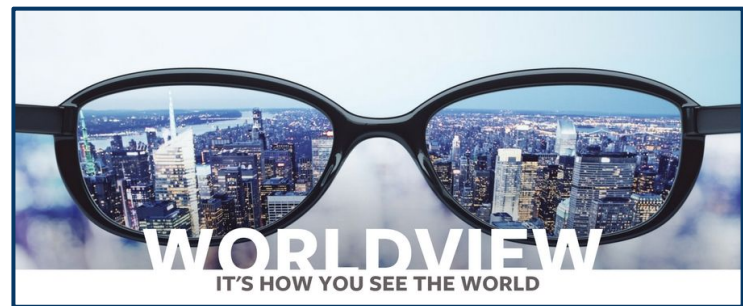

This course is designed to give students clarity and conviction to face the challenges of the future. To equip them for this task, students will spend time listening to lectures, discussing course materials, reading and studying the Scripture, completing homework assignments, in-class quizzes, tests, and presentations. Students will be expected to attend class regularly, on time, having completed all reading and homework assignments before class begins.

We will utilize the Bible and one textbook each semester. The goal for the first semester is proficiency in articulating the foundations of the faith and an introduction to the concepts of apologetics, worldview, and cultural engagement. The goal for the second semester is proficiency in apologetics, worldview, and cultural engagement.
