The REACH Kzoo Board warmly welcomes you to our community. We hope that by being involved with REACH Kzoo, you feel supported, encouraged, inspired, and loved. We express our deep gratitude that you are entrusting us to serve you and your families. We are trusting the Lord Jesus for an abundant harvest as a result of this endeavor to serve the Kalamazoo area homeschool community.

Introduction

In the spring of 2020, during the COVID-19 pandemic, seven local homeschool moms gathered via Zoom. Their meeting focused on their shared, prayerful desire to provide a community for fellowship as well as shared educational experiences for their families.

Their desire came to fruition as REACH Kzoo, a non-profit corporation formed to provide access to enrichment opportunities for homeschooling families in Southwest Michigan, consistent with core Christian beliefs and values rooted in the Biblical Word of God.

REACH Kzoo is *as much* a mission of Christ as it is an educational organization. Without the ability to fully and clearly preach, teach, and adhere to all of Christ's Word, the organization would fail to exist. Facility Use

REACH Kzoo is extremely grateful to Lighthouse Community Church for allowing us a place to gather for classes on Wednesdays. We seek to build and maintain a mutual respect with the church, and therefore expect the following guidelines to be followed by all students, parents and tutors:

- Food is only permitted in the main lobby area. No food or colored beverages are allowed in the classrooms or gym, unless being used for that specific class/instruction and deemed appropriate by the tutor.
- The kitchen is off limits at all times, unless being used by the cooking class. Microwaves can be found on either end of the lobbies for student and family use.
- All classrooms are off limits unless class is in session and students are registered for that particular class.
- The main, open lobby area is open to parents and children for free study who are not taking classes at any particular hour.
- Bronson Park is a designated quiet study location during 1st-3rd periods. <u>This is not a social area</u>, rather a quiet area for students and parents to work. Please be respectful of others using this area. If people are loud/noisy they will be asked to remove themselves to the lobby for the remainder of the day.
- No playground supervisors will be on duty during the entire co-op day. If the child is not in a class, due to liability requirements, they must be accompanied by their parent or designated responsible adult (siblings do not count) if they are outside of the building anywhere within the church grounds including the playground areas.

- The Gym is off limits with the exception of the lunch half-hour, where children can play IF supervised by a parent/guardian. No food or colored beverages are allowed in the gym area, unless the co-op is having a community potluck for any given celebration.
- Parking a motor vehicle is only permitted in the parking lot. All grassy areas are off-limits for parking
- If Lighthouse Community Church or REACH Kzoo property is damaged, the parent/family of that child is responsible to fix the damage.
- Students are expected to WALK in the hallways. Running and horseplay are not permitted.
- No students are allowed on the gym stage or in the sound booth at all times. No children/adults are allowed to sit on the stage, as this damages the face of the stage.
- Due to liability, damage and safety issues, no recreational ride-on or wheeled devices will be permitted at co-op.

This includes: skateboards, scooters, roller skates, "Heelys" tennis shoes, and bicycles.

- If your child eats lunch outside, please make sure they throw away all trash in the garbage cans.
- REACH Kzoo is a drug-free, alcohol-free, weapon-free campus. This is a zero-tolerance expectation. All violators will be removed from co-op.

Lost and Found

REACH Kzoo has a designated lost and found area near the Welcome Center. If you have found an item, please bring it to this location. If you have lost an item, please check the lost and found before you leave. Items are able to be saved for two weeks before donating them to charity.

Fees & Membership

REACH Kzoo charges an annual, non-refundable membership fee of \$60 per family.

Membership runs from May 15th - May 14th of the following year. We do not prorate for partial year membership. To renew your membership, update your family profile and pay the membership fee each year by May 14th. A family's account must be current and active in order to participate in class registration on June 1st.

The membership fee allows for access to our interactive website and all the information it contains including our event calendar, member discussion & question forums, a classified section, a photo gallery, online class registration, classroom dashboards and forums, and participation in all REACH Kzoo sponsored events including Mom's groups, prayer groups, park days, field trips, teen events, and more. The fee also goes towards administrative and material costs to run the organization.

Please note, the membership fee as well as any outstanding debts or expenses due to any damage caused by you or your child(ren) must be paid before you can register for classes or participate in co-op activities.

Tuition fees are set by tutors who use the building to hold classes. Each individual tutor determines the price and supply fees for his or her class. All class tuition fee transactions happen between the tutor and the family.

Conflict Resolution

Unfortunately, conflicts and misunderstandings can happen. It is important that we address how to deal with these situations, should they arise.

Based on Matthew 18, if conflict arises, parents and tutors should seek to resolve the issue on their own. Please, immediately discuss your concerns without accusations with the person who has offended you (James 4:11-12).

If a tutor and a student or family are having a difficult time finding a resolution, a representative of the REACH Kzoo board may act as a third party mediator if requested to do so.



Illness Policy

REACH Kzoo will be implementing a strict illness policy. Please be considerate of others as these rules are for the protection of all of our families. Please adhere to the following expectations:

- Do not come to the co-op if anyone in your family has had the stomach bug in the last 48 hours.
- You and your child must be fever-free for 24 hours without the aid of an antipyretic (Tylenol/Ibuprofen). A fever is defined as a temperature greater than 99 degrees.
- Do not come to co-op if you or your child have shown any of the following symptoms in the 24 hour period before the day of co-op: Sore throat, rash, severe coughing, severe nasal discharge requiring frequent nose blowing, eye discharge, lice, or any other communicable disease (including but not limited to: skin infections, chicken pox, and measles).
- If you have been prescribed an antibiotic, we require 48 hours of medication before you attend co-op.
- If a child shows signs of sickness while at co-op and parent is not present, they will be quarantined in designated area of lobby and immediate notification of parents will occur

Parent & Student Service Commitment

REACH Kzoo is a cooperative, meaning parents and teens have an integral role in the organization's ability to provide a clean, safe and effective learning environment. In order for our cooperative to function we require parents and students (grades 6-12) to sign up for a service commitment at the time of registration. Parents may pay an opt out fee of \$150.00. We appreciate your help in making this great community run well and we hope you find it enjoyable.

One parent from every family will serve the amount of hours according to the "Service Commitment Break Down" below:

1-2 Classes = 5 hours 3-4 Classes = 10 hours 5+ Classes = 15 hours

<u>All</u> students grades 6-12 will serve approximately 20 minutes per week. They will choose an opportunity to serve based on a time that works with their class schedule. Service time will be recorded and students will be given certificates reflecting service hours completed at the end of the year.

"Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others as faithful stewards of God's grace." ~I Peter 3:16

In the event that you cannot be present to complete your service duties, you are responsible to secure a substitute in order to avoid a monetary penalty.

While we believe in grace if your duties are not fulfilled, you may be reassigned to another service task at the discretion of the Service Coordinator.

Consequences for missing service duty:

An "Unexcused Absence" is defined as the failure to complete a service task.

Adults, if you are unable to fulfill a reassigned duty due to an unexcused absence, you will be assessed a \$25 fine. If it is a repeated offense you will be charged a prorated opt out fee. If fines are not paid, your family will not be able to register for future REACH Kzoo classes until the balance is paid. In addition, you will be required to pay the opt out fee the following year.

Students, if you do not fulfill your duty you will receive a verbal warning from the LEAD of that service area. The 2nd occurrence will result in notification to your parents by email. Three or more occurrences will result in a \$15 charge per episode.

PARENT SERVICE COMMITMENT CHOICES

WELCOME CENTER

The REACH Kzoo Welcome Center is an important and vital job to our co-op. Co-Op members are a welcoming face to families and visitors and are key to answering questions and directing people to the appropriate person/place. Welcome Center duties also include: general sanitation of lobby tables, disinfection of high touch surfaces throughout the building, safety checks for 1:1 tutors, basic first aid and signing off students for midday job duties. Shifts will be 1.5 hours.

<u>SET UP</u>

Each parent on this team will help prepare the building to open for classes on Wednesdays. Set-up duties include: posting signage, setting up white boards, tables, and chairs. The commitment is approximately 20 minutes (from 8:00-8:25 AM) each week for ONE semester (the first few weeks parents will be asked to arrive a little earlier until a routine is established).

TEARDOWN

We want to leave LCC as clean as we found it so the main goal of this team is to reset the facility. Teardown duties include: cleaning floors, windows, bathrooms, etc. The commitment is approximately 20 minutes (various times at the end of the day) each week.

STUDENT SERVICE COMMITMENT CHOICES

<u>SET UP</u>

The main duty of this group is to prepare the building for the day by setting up tables and chairs. The commitment is approximately 20 minutes (from 7:35-7:55) each week for ONE semester (the first few weeks students will be asked to arrive a little earlier until a routine is established).

MID-DAY RESET

Duties include: wiping off tables, emptying trash, bathroom walk-thrus, putting the microwave away, etc. Each student on this team will serve for approximately 15 minutes at some point during the day each week.

TEARDOWN

Students will serve to reset the building. There are two shifts to accomplish this task in an efficient manner. Shift A serves 2:30-3:00 and Shift B serves 4:00-4:30. Tasks usually take approximately 20 minutes and may include: emptying trash, taking down tables and stacking chairs, resetting rooms per church's instructions, taking trash to dumpsters and vacuuming are some of the responsibilities of this team. This commitment will be approximately 20 minutes.

Parent Expectations

To help keep all children safe, we ask that all parents actively keep a lookout for children who are running, rough-housing, or being disrespectful to church property. If a parent observes unsafe behavior, we ask that he/she gently remind the child/children of the importance of behaving in a manner that is safe and respectful to all and to report dangerous behavior to a REACH Kzoo Board member.

We ask that parents help keep our premises clean and tidy. We ask that food only be consumed within designated areas. We also ask that if a parent sees a trash can that needs to be emptied, he/she will report that to the Welcome Center in order to remedy the situation.

To keep children safe, we expect parents to be onsite and available for children under the age of 10, unless they are taking a class. If the child is not in a class, due to liability requirements, they must be accompanied by their parent or designated responsible adult (siblings do not count) if they are outside of the building anywhere within the church grounds including the playground areas.

If you choose to have another adult be designated as the responsible party for your child/children, we have forms available on the website and at the Welcome Center. You must complete, sign and turn the form into the REACH Kzoo Board releasing all care to the designated supervising adult of your choice. If a parent does not follow this rule, someone will contact the parent by phone one time. If that parent offends again, their family's participation at REACH Kzoo may be ended with no refunds available.

Student Expectations

We love our students! We believe the Lord has great things in store for each child, and view our students as people who have great potential and purpose. In order for REACH to function safely and responsibly, we have the following guidelines for our students:

- We ask that our students show thoughtfulness and respect to all tutors/parents, other students and church staff, as well as the building and premises.
- We ask that our students be willing to accept guidance and correction from adults and/or teens in charge of classes and activities.
- We expect healthy, intelligent language. We do not allow foul language, rude jokes, or bullying. No sexual harassment will be tolerated. In addition, climbing on/being disrespectful to church property, kicking, slapping, and/or pushing is not permitted.

- *Students are not allowed on the stage or sound booth at any time per the request of the church*
- We do not allow cell phones, electronic games or personal music in or during class, unless given permission by the instructor.
- We ask that students eat ONLY in permitted areas.

A failure to adhere to the above guidelines will result in removal from co-op, at the discretion and review of the Kzoo REACH Board.

Discipline

At REACH Kzoo, we aim to foster a peaceful, safe environment. In order to create this environment, we must create guidelines for discipline.

If a parent or child's behavior violates our parent/student expectation policies, the student and family will receive a warning by the tutor and/or a representative of the REACH Kzoo board.

If the behavior continues and the parent or child has already received a verbal warning, a written warning will be issued from the class tutor or REACH Kzoo Board, and the student might be asked to leave the premises for the remainder of the day. A student must submit the parent-signed warning to a board member before the student is allowed to return to his/her class. If a child continues to disobey the rules as outlined in the handbook, the student and/or family may be dismissed from that class or from REACH Kzoo and no fees will be refunded.

Exceptions to this rule: Behaviors that include overt physical aggression or sexual misconduct will result in an incident review by the board and an immediate removal from REACH Kzoo classes, with no refunds.

Dress Code

In our desire to honor God first and in accordance with 1 Corinthians 6:19-20, we ask that students and parents alike who attend REACH Kzoo dress modestly. If you are questioning whether or not you should wear an item of clothing for fear that it may cause others to stumble (for example a revealing top, miniskirt, or a boy wearing a dress or a skirt) we ask that you pick something else to wear that would be more respectful to yourself and others.

Use of Electronics

As for cell phones and devices that can connect to the internet, we remind parents, students, and all tutors of Psalm 101:2-3 "I will walk in integrity and with a blameless heart. I will set before my eyes no evil thing." We ask that you use discernment regarding what you look at and show to others, especially with many young students at co-op.

Cell phone use is not allowed during classes, unless deemed necessary by the tutor of that class. All cell phone use must be free from inappropriate content.

The following actions are strictly prohibited on the Wi-Fi system:

- Any actions that are not consistent with biblically-based beliefs of our organization
- Any activities that violate the church's, local, state, or federal statutes
