Financial Policies

Tuition Policy:

Tuition for this class is \$150.00 + \$30.00 (Non-refundable) Materials Fee payable to Julie Renzema. Full payment is expected by 09/08/2021.

Late Payments & Refunds:

Late payments will be charged a \$10.00 late fee for each week the payment is late.

If the class is dropped before the 3rd week of class a prorated tuition refund will be given, after this day no refunds will be given.

LAMP Students:

I will accept LAMP funds as payment for the tuition fee.

- \$25 (Non-refundable) Registration fee due at Registration is for all students. This secures your seat in this class. No post-dated checks.
- The tuition amount to be submitted to LAMP is \$150.00. LAMP does not cover material fees or books.
- Please notify me by email as soon as you know the monthly amount LAMP will be paying for this class.
- Any LAMP tuition shortages must be paid by October 20, 2021.
- Any missed monthly payments from LAMP will be charged to the family and due no later than the 3rd Wednesday of the month. Anything after that will receive a late fee.
- If a student drops the class, the remaining tuition payment for the semester is expected within a week of the student leaving the class.
